Eden Food For Change

A Report From our Chair & CEO ★

The year 2020 will never be forgotten. It was a year where the global pandemic, COVID-19, impacted citizens across the country, around the world. Here in our own community, the need for support among the most vulnerable was intensified. We saw so many organizations step up to serve our community throughout the crisis when our residents needed them most, including first responders, health care workers and others who kept our city moving. Food banks, shelters, and countless other charities increased their capacity to serve when the needs were amplified. We honour and thank each one of you who served our Community with bravery during one of the worst crises it has ever seen. You are the true heroes, and in this publication, we salute you.

The Community Foundation of Mississauga (CFM) is proud of the role we played in supporting our residents through the charitable sector. One of our key functions of granting took on primary importance last year. When the World Health Organization announced a global health emergency due to a new virus strain, COVID-19, the Foundation launched its Mississauga Emergency Relief Fund in order to make rapid microgrants. These helped to support immediate needs so that charities could continue to support their constituents. Soon after, we received a grant from the Government of Canada for the Emergency Community Support Fund that sustained charities serving a variety of needs for our community's most vulnerable citizens. These included basic needs such as food, shelter and winter clothing, and support services such as homeless outreach, mental health programs, and call centres for those experiencing violence. Those suffering from isolation and persons with disabilities were also supported along with a host of other urgent needs. This funding put almost \$2 million into the hands of charities across Mississauga so that they could deliver necessary support, programs and services.

Additionally, our annual grant round took place, providing valuable funding to fulfill a variety of other non-emergency requests. This meant that thanks to our incredible Fund Holders, nearly \$1 million was granted to projects across Mississauga. Continuing to provide programming was essential in the face of the pandemic. A broad spectrum of grants was made across all disciplines, and many of these focused on allowing charities to conduct programs virtually as they played their critical roles.

Our Fund Holders are an integral part the Community Foundation. Their vision in creating Funds that have a meaningful impact in our community will result in a thriving charitable sector in Mississauga thanks to their generosity. In 2020, we welcomed two new Fund Holders to our family – the SKM-Chari Family Fund, and the Novo Nordisk Fund.

We are proud to report that in 2020, we made 197 grants from all sources including Fund Holders and Emergency Funding. These grants totaled almost \$3 million to charities supporting our community. In a year when charities stepped in and stepped up, these funds were essential to Mississauga's citizens. This brings the total funds granted more than \$20 million since we began granting at the CFM in 2006. We are proud of the role we have played in supporting our community across all sectors over the last 19 years.

In 2020, our ongoing Vital Conversations series supported the priorities of our local community of charities. We launched the "Vital Conversations in Covid-19 Times" version, where each conversation featured experts providing pertinent information as guidance and inspiration to our stakeholders. The first in the series was "Regional Grantmakers Discussion", and the sessions continued into 2021.

While grant making was critical to the Foundation, we also needed to ensure support for our operations. We thank our Corporate "Partners in Action" for standing beside us to allow us to continue to play a vital role in our community. Your generosity in providing sustaining funds means the world to us.

In 2020, our in-person fundraising events were curtailed to ensure the safety of our guests. We are happy to report that we held the Dancing with Mississauga Stars fundraiser virtually in November. It featured special guests, flashbacks to our past competitions, food demos and even a dance lesson!

We thank our staff and volunteers for continuing to lead throughout 2020. Our Board, and the many committees, provided wisdom and advice as we pivoted our priorities from our long-term goal of endowment building to focusing on supporting the immediate needs in our community. Our staff were relentless in their goal of supporting Mississauga as we continued our vital work. We sincerely thank everyone who played a role in navigating through the past year.

This Annual Report is dedicated to the many acts of heroism that we have witnessed throughout 2020. The challenges we faced were unprecedented to be sure, and served to bring out the very best in people who worked tirelessly to fill the critical needs of our community. Individually, your contributions are inspiring, and collectively, the impact is extraordinary. Thank you for playing a significant role in supporting the Foundation and our community in these unprecedented times.

Mississauga Food Bank

The Mississauga Food Bank relieves hunger in Mississauga by providing and promoting access to healthy food for people in need. This mission has never been more important as our community has had to contend with the impacts of the worldwide pandemic.

In 2020, The Mississauga Food Bank received three grants to assist with The Mississauga Food Bank's continued support for our community: The Emergency Community Support Fund (ECSF), the Pendle Fund and the Mississauga Emergency Support Fund. With programs like Feeding Hungry Neighbours in Mississauga, Food Bank 2 Home and others, additional food support was provided to the community to keep up with the increased demand due to COVID-19.



The impact of the pandemic saw family budgets stretched to capacity. As well, layoffs and isolation meant families struggled to keep up with their daily needs and expenses, and they were turning to the Food Bank for the first time to ensure they could feed their families.

The Community Foundation of Mississauga's grants ensured that families had the food they needed when they turned to The Mississauga Food Bank. One grant funded the Food Bank 2 Home program. A record amount of food was sourced, stored, and delivered to vulnerable clients with mobility and transportation challenges. With support from our Foundation along with so many generous funders, this program met the needs of hungry neighbours across Mississauga.

As the pandemic continues, the Foundation salutes the work of The Mississauga Food Bank and the food banks across Mississauga serving our community.



2 Friends of the Museums of Mississauga

Thanks to the Hazel McCallion Fund for Arts, Culture and Heritage, the Friends of the Museums received a grant in support of the WAR Flowers project. Inspired by the pressed flowers picked by Canadian soldier Lieutenant-Colonel George Stephen Cantlie in the gardens, fields and hedges of war-torn Europe and sent to his baby daughter in Montreal, it is an immersive, multisensory experience. The exhibit brings to life Cantlie's letters, featuring specially commissioned optical crystal sculptures and original flower-based scents, interwoven with the personal stories of 10 Canadians directly involved in the war. The exhibition was designed to enhance Canadians' understanding of our shared heritage through these emotional and immersive experiences. The multisensory components enabled visitors to connect deeply with the human stories of war, which are often overshadowed by dates and facts.

At the same time, there was a smaller exhibition about the First World War's fallen soldiers from Mississauga called Our Boys. It paid respect to members of the Canadian Expeditionary Forces who fought for our freedom over 100 years ago, ensuring that their sacrifices and contributions are remembered by today's communities. The exhibits also helped residents to see their own family histories reflected back to them, including the contributions of Indigenous, Sikh and Black soldiers in WWI. These powerful stories transcend time and illustrate important moments in Canada's shared history.

3 Seva Food Bank

In 2020, Seva Food bank received two grants: through the Emergency Community Support Fund (ECSF) they were able to make technological updates to support their COVID-19 operations, and through the Pendle Fund they piloted a Teaching Garden.

The ECSF Grant allowed Seva to make upgrades to its technology that would ensure they could continue to serve their clients in a safe and secure way. Faster reception computers were installed to allow staff and volunteers to locate client families in the system, sign them in for their visit and update their family account information. Clients could also sign themselves up for their next appointment using new tablets. This technology allows for future plans such as effective online booking for virtual cooking classes that will leverage their onsite chef and community teaching kitchen.

Piloting a Teaching Garden reinforces Seva Food Bank's fight against hunger through promoting self-sufficiency in the community. The project aims to demonstrate small-scale farming and enhance the skills levels in the community to grow, harvest and preserve fresh food. Showcasing gardens such as a raised garden bed, container garden and balcony planters takes into consideration accessibility, low maintenance, and showcases a variety of ways that clients can grow healthy food in small spaces.

The Community Foundation of Mississauga is delighted to support the initiatives at the Seva Food Bank that not only meet the needs of our community today but educate them for their future.



4 Safe City Mississauga

Safe City Mississauga provides community leadership for crime prevention through education, research, collaboration and citizen engagement. In 2020, through the Smart and Caring Children and Youth Fund, Project Counter-Act Research was funded.

The Project Counter-Act Research is a study that provided evidence-based research into youth gang prevention and intervention methods, as well as best practices. This research has provided the foundation for a new program that was developed that will counteract youth gang coercion and encourage gang departure; plans are underway for a program meant to intervene on the causes of gang entry. The success of this program will curb the gang violence emerging in Mississauga and improve feelings of safety among its residents.

Through the Emergency Community Support Fund, Safe City Mississauga also received a grant to support a Crime Prevention Management System. Due to Covid-19, it became necessary to digitize the volunteer & client management database and integrate it with a Learning Management System (LMS), to allow for an online service option to clients and program participants. Thanks to this grant, children can stay connected with the tutoring programs, seniors can access their Neighborhood Watch, and those experiencing domestic or gender-based violence can now find educational materials, forums and webinars online.

The Foundation is a proud supporter of Safe City Mississauga and the impact they make within our community.



5 The Compass

The Compass Food Bank & Outreach Centre is an outreach center and food bank located in Port Credit that provides a variety of supports to community members whose poverty has made them vulnerable.

Through our Emergency Community Support Fund, a 2020 grant supported the hiring of additional registered therapists to enhance mental health support, as well as food and hygiene items. As a result, a positive impact was made in the lives of many clients, providing a safe and welcoming place for people to come to for help, and offering immediate assistance with food. Staff work with clients to provide practical and spiritual support for the challenges that often come along with a low income. The Compass mission statement: “Together, we provide help for today and hope for tomorrow”, was reinforced as needs continued to rise during the COVID-19 pandemic.

The clients of The Compass are forever grateful for its support:

“I came from Iraq 2 years ago when I had to leave as a result of the war...The Compass offered me training, support and a fresh start. It doesn't feel like I'm visiting a food bank — I feel like I'm visiting family”

The Community Foundation of Mississauga is honoured to be able to help make a difference in the lives of the vulnerable in our community through its support of the Compass Food Bank & Outreach Centre.

6 Vibe Arts

Through the Hazel McCallion Fund for Arts, Culture and Heritage, The Community Foundation of Mississauga was excited to fund a program with ViBE Arts, in collaboration with Peel Youth Village, called Elevate. This grant was used to create a series of accessible programming for the youth and residents of Peel Youth Village Shelter.

Together with the shelter, Vibe developed a 4-week mural painting program plus 2-weeks of actual mural painting, culminating in a brand-new mural installation. The residents and participants of the program contributed to creating the piece which will be installed in the physical activity/ gym room. In addition to the mural painting program, Vibe also developed a 6-week watercolor program and a 6-week spoken word program delivered virtually.

Due to COVID-19 protocols, 10 iPads were purchased and art kits were prepared and filled with all the supplies necessary for participants to use while practicing social distancing measures. The arts facilitators produced video tutorials for participants to follow, and the facilitator met with the youth to discuss their learnings and go over new techniques. Once their weekly session was complete, the iPads and supplies are sanitized, and rotated to a next set of participants.

In total, ViBE continued programming for 40 youth/residents at the shelter. Providing them with creative ways to engage resulted in greater harm reduction, healthier decision making and increased confidence and pride.

We celebrate with ViBE, knowing that this program continues to be one of the highlights of the participants' day.

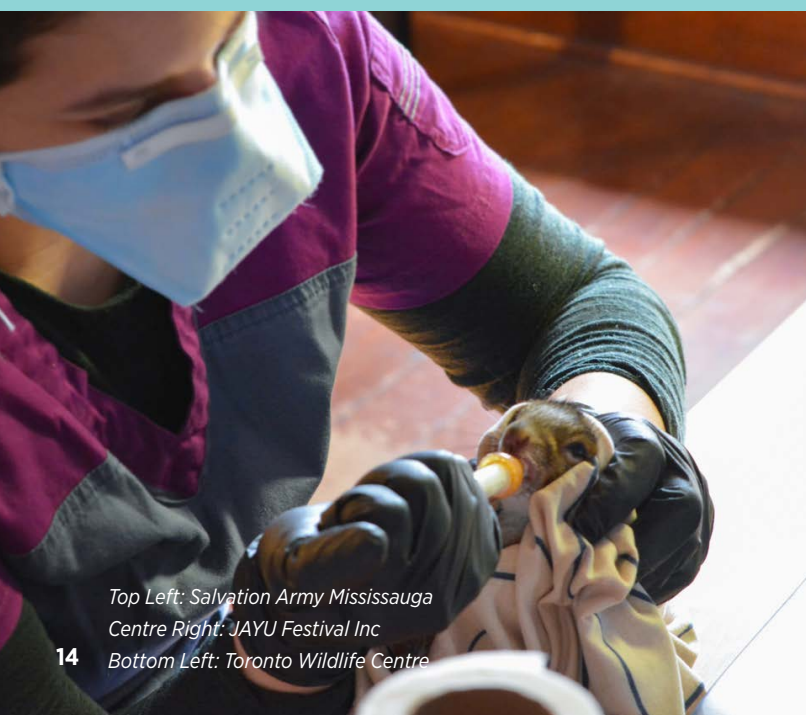


Creating endowed funds is the heart of what our community foundation offers to donors.

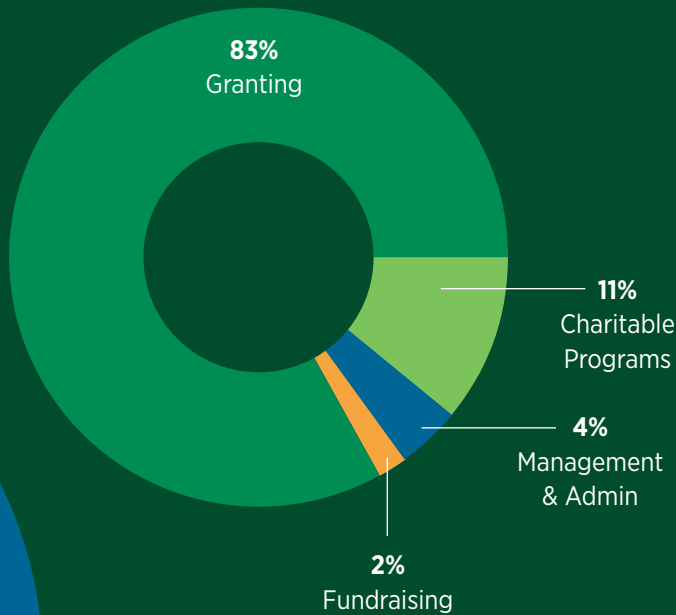
